experiment and create. Through their ancestor's traditional rhythms, they fuse Mexican regional sounds and connect Latin American folklore, cumbia, samba jazz and rock.





RECIPE

Syrian Beet Salad Terry Smith

I want to share this recipe because it's what I've made for so many of our Hoo-Devil camp Sunday night potluck extravaganzas. In fact, it's my go-to contribution for most pot-lucks because it's bright, earthy, and fresh. It's always a hit and you can make it ahead of time and add the parsley when you're ready to serve it.

I first found this recipe in a gorgeous cook book a friend gifted me and I don't do much to change it because it's perfect the way it is. (Aromas of Aleppo: The Legendary Cuisine of Syrian Jews by Poopa Dweck and Michael J. Cohen)

NOTES: Use fresh-squeezed lemon and tamarind concentrate or paste, not sauce. This is the brand I've been able to find in Middle Eastern, Indian stores, organic food stores, and weirdly, offbrand tubs in the deli at Safeway:



Ingredients

6 beets (1 kilo) 1/2 cup chopped parsley 1/2 small onion chopped 1/4 cup

Dressing

1 TBSP olive oil
3 TBSP lemon juice
2 TBSP tamarind paste
1 TBSP ground cumin
pinch of crushed chile pepper paste (The recipe calls for white Allepo pepper)
1 tsp salt, or to taste

Directions

- Peel beets, cut in half and simmer in boiling water for 20 minutes or fork tender, but still firm. Rinse under cold water. (I save the beet water and freeze it for a richer broth when I make Borscht)
- Cut into cubes, 1/4-1/2"
- Add chopped onions
- Make dressing, pour over mixture, and mix
- Chop and fold in parsley before serving (I use Italian parsley when I'm sure the salad will be devoured, and curly parsley if I think there will be leftovers)
